NHS Wi-Fi

The following steps will guide you through how to gain access to the NHS Wi-Fi that is now available at GP Practices.

1. Connecting to NHS Wi-Fi

From your device connect to the Wi-Fi named 'NHS Wi-Fi'. (Device specific instructions are given at the end of these instructions).

Note: Please note it is not the responsibility of the practice or IT provider to configure or fix any issues with your device in order to connect to the NHS Wi-Fi.



2. NHS Wi-Fi Registration and Enrolment

Once you have successfully connected to the NHS Wi-Fi a registration screen will pop up as shown below. (Android phones may require you to open the web browser manually)

- Read the terms & conditions
- Fill in your First name, Surname and Email address
- Tap the LOG IN button



3. Post-Authentication Screen

Once you have successfully joined NHS Wi-Fi you will be taken to the postauthentication screen shown below.

The Post-Authentication screen contains advice and guidance such as 'Get help to stop smoking'.

There are also a number of apps you can download.

The content is hosted and maintained by NHS Digital.

From this point you can open a separate web browser to surf the internet, use apps such as Facebook etc.







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Summary

- Connect to NHS Wi-Fi.
- Read terms & conditions, then complete the registration and enrolment process.
- If you wish navigate away from the post-authentication screen then open a separate web page.

Device specific instructions

iPhone



- From your Home screen, go to Settings > Wi-Fi.
- Turn on Wi-Fi.

Your device will automatically search for available Wi-Fi networks.

Tap the name of the Wi-Fi network that you want to join.

After you join the network, you'll see

next to the network and
in the upper-left corner of your display.

The registration and enrolment screen will 'pop up'.

Note: there is no password required.





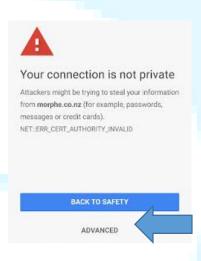


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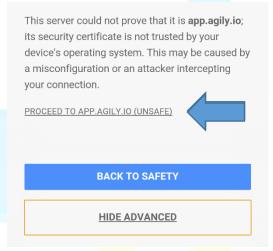
Android device



- Swipe down from the top of your phone and tap on the Wi-Fi button.
 Alternatively, from the Home page, go to Apps > Settings and tap on the button next to Wi-Fi so that it turns green with a line down the middle.
- Tap on 'Wi-Fi' to see the list of available networks. It may take a
 moment for all available networks to show up. You can force your device
 to check for networks by tapping on 'Scan'.
- Select the network you would like to use. If this is an open Wi-Fi connection, you will automatically connect without any further action needed, but be aware that this will not be secure. Note: there is no password required.
- Open a web browser and type then search for something.



 You may be presented with a screen stating 'your connection is not private. Click the 'advanced' button.



• Another screen will pop up then press the 'proceed to' link. You should then be redirected to the registration and enrolment screen.

Windows Laptop

- Select the **Network** are or icon in the notification area at the bottom right of your task bar
- In the list of networks, choose the network named 'NHS Wi-Fi' and then select Connect.
- Open up your web browser to complete the registration process.
